Dundee Cake

Ingredients:

6oz. Table Margarine
6oz. Sugar
8oz. Plain Flour
1 ½ Level Tablespoons of Baking Powder
3 Eggs
1lb Mixed Dried Fruit
2oz. Chopped Almonds
2oz. Split Almonds
2oz. Cherries
2oz. Peel
2 Tablespoons of Milk
1 Teaspoon of Spice

Method:

Cream the margarine and egg together until soft and light. Add the beaten egg.

Sieve dry ingredients together. Chop a few of the almonds and split the others.

Mix the chopped almonds, floured cherries, fruit and peel together. Stir in the flour and enough milk to make a slow dropping consistency, and then lastly put in the fruit. Put into a greased and floured 8" cake tin. Cover with the split almonds and brush with a little egg white to glaze. Bake for 2-2¼ hours in the centre of a very moderate oven (325-350F / Gas Mark 3 / 165-177C) reducing the heat after 1½ hours if wished.

Cool slightly in tin before turning onto a wire rack.
